The Dos and Don't of Enjoying the Beach with your Dog

Summer is in full swing, bringing with it plenty of opportunities to enjoy the beach. You can have fun beach days with your dog as long as you plan ahead and make sure your pup is taken care of. The American Kennel Club offers the following dos and don'ts to help dog owners enjoy the beach with their four-legged friends.

- ✓ DON'T let your dog drink ocean water. Drinking salt water is dangerous for your dog, as the excessive sodium can make them very sick. DO pack a portable water bowl and fresh water for your dog. You can also put ice cubes in your cooler as a frozen treat for him.
- ✓ DO provide shade. Bring an umbrella with you if you'll be staying at the beach for an extended period of time so your dog can have a place to rest and escape the sun.
- DON'T forget your dog's sunscreen. Hairless and light-skinned dogs have a high probability of getting sunburned. It's wise to apply dog-safe sunscreen so your four-legged friend is protected.
- DO rinse off. Salt and sand can irritate your dog's coat, so be sure to rinse him off when he's done playing.

Summer Safety Tips (from AKC)

Soaking up bright golden rays is irresistible as we enter the summer. But, it's important to make

preparations to safeguard your dog's health before hitting the beach or even backyard. Sunshine may make you happy, but it also poses some hazards. Here are four summer safety tips:

Stay in the shade when the sun is at its most intense, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. Heatstroke is an ever-present risk, as is damage to delicate paw pads from walking on blistering-hot pavement. It's a good idea to take off your own shoes and test a surface before asking your dog to trot along beside you. When possible, walk on the grass.

Watch for signs that your dog could be overheating. These include:

- Slowing down, especially if a dog who was out front starts lagging behind,
- A change in gum color from pink to red,
- Excessive panting.
- If you see any of these signs, find some shade and cool your dog down. Carry plenty of water, and a 50-50 mixture of water and Pedialyte or Gatorade to replenish vital electrolytes.
- Water-soaked T-shirts and neckerchiefs are helpful, as are the more hightech versions of these items, such as cooling or "thermoregulating" vests and bandanas. Beds, pillow inserts, and mats, using the same technology, are also popular among dog owners.
- Also, **don't forget the sunscreen**. Dogs can get sunburned, too. Those most at risk have light skin, fair hair, and thin coats. Choosing a product specifically for animals, and applying it an hour or two before going out. Slather it on ear tips, the nose, and any areas that might catch some rays, include the belly if you have a dog who loves to sunbathe.
